Eric P. Winer, M.D. is chief scientific advisor for Susan G. Komen for the Cure®. In that role, Dr. Winer leads a group of top-level scientific and medical advisors on Komen's Scientific Advisory Board, which guides the organization on scientific and medical issues related to breast cancer. He helps shape Komen's research grants strategy as well as messages regarding emerging breast cancer issues and educational messages.

In addition to his responsibilities at Komen for the Cure, Dr. Winer serves as chief, Division of Women's Cancers and as the Thompson Senior Investigator in Breast Cancer Research at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute where he leads a multidisciplinary group of clinicians and investigators focused on caring for individuals with breast cancer and identifying new and better approaches to treatment. He is also a professor of medicine at Harvard Medical School.

Widely published, with more than 200 articles, clinical communications, reviews, book chapters and editorials, Dr. Winer also serves on the editorial boards of several peer-reviewed publications, including the *Journal of Clinical Oncology* and *Breast Cancer Research and Treatment*.

Dr. Winer is co-chair of the Cancer and Leukemia Group B Breast Committee and serves on the board of the Triple Negative Breast Cancer Foundation.

After graduating from Yale University in 1978 with a degree in history and Russian/Eastern European studies, Dr. Winer earned his medical degree from Yale School of Medicine in 1983, followed by training in internal medicine at Yale. He then moved to Duke University Medical Center and completed a fellowship in medical oncology in 1989. On the Duke faculty, he specialized in breast cancer and became co-director of the institution's Multidisciplinary Breast Program. He remained at Duke until 1997 when he moved to Dana-Farber and joined the Harvard faculty.
