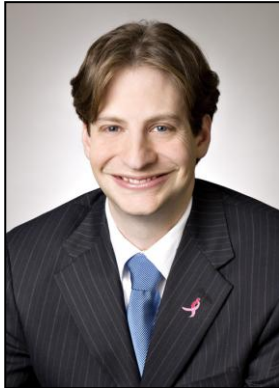

Jonathan S. Blum General Counsel



As general counsel for Susan G. Komen for the Cure®, the world’s largest grassroots network of breast cancer survivors and activists, Jonathan Blum is responsible for overseeing the organization’s legal department, which includes guiding the international headquarters and its more than 120 Affiliates in securing responsible partnerships with corporations and partners. He has lead functional responsibility for legal, insurance and internal audit matters. Blum joined Komen for the Cure in 2007 as associate general counsel.

Prior to joining Komen, Blum was a senior associate in the corporate department of Weil, Gotshal & Manges LLP in Dallas. He was instrumental in establishing the firm’s Lend-a-Lawyer program with Legal Aid of Northwest Texas.

Recognizing that most people interact with legal services at some point in their lives, Blum sees pro bono service to those who have limited resources as a professional obligation. In 2004, Blum was named “Pro Bono Attorney of the Year” by the Dallas Volunteer Attorney Program, a joint program of the Dallas Bar Association and Legal Aid of Northwest Texas. Representing Komen today, he encourages law firms to provide their services pro bono in order to enable the organization and its Affiliates to most efficiently and effectively move forward in the fight against breast cancer.

Blum wrote “The FTAA and the Fast Track to Forgetting the Environment: A Comparison of the NAFTA and the MERCOSUR Environmental Models as Examples for the Hemisphere,” published in the *Texas International Law Journal* in 2000. Blum is fluent in Spanish and spent several academic semesters in Latin America.

Blum graduated with honors from the University of Texas School of Law after earning his Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Texas, with a double major in Government and Plan II Honors (liberal arts honors curriculum) as well as a minor in Spanish.
