Kimberly Simpson Earle joined Susan G. Komen for the Cure® in April 2007. Beginning her career with Komen for the Cure as vice president and general counsel as well as secretary of the board of directors, her principal responsibility was to manage the legal affairs of the organization as well as the organization's internal audit and risk management groups. She quickly moved into the role of chief operating officer, and in addition to her original responsibilities, now leads the network of more than 120 Komen Affiliates across the United States. She also has responsibility for the organization's human resources, information technology, and internal communications functions, and is the secretary and member of the board of directors of the Susan G. Komen for the Cure Advocacy Alliance.

Prior to joining Komen, Earle was vice president and general counsel at Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children in Dallas. As a member of the hospital's executive team, she served as the principal legal advisor and worked closely with hospital administration to develop processes benefiting the hospital's patients and supporters.

In addition to her legal experience, Earle has an extensive business and marketing background. Before joining Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children, she worked as a director for BroadVision, Inc., marketing e-commerce products and services, and she previously worked as an advertising account executive, promoting packaged goods to Spanish-speaking audiences.

Earle received her Juris Doctor from Boalt Hall School of Law at the University of California, Berkeley. She has a Master of Arts in journalism/public relations from The University of Texas and a Bachelor of Arts in Spanish *summa cum laude* from The University of Alabama.
